BACKGROUND: Bullying, fagging, cultism and related offenses in schools are major challenges globally. Schools know much about the negative and long-term consequences of bullying, fagging and related offenses, but less about how to translate these understandings into interventions for building a safe learning environment. There is a noticeable upsurge in cases of bullying and attack on the African great school brands of recent. Yet educators have a major priority of providing a caring, safe and respectful social environment in which learning can flourish. In addition, they must support students to develop skills and competencies for managing their social environment, future learning, and life in general.

WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

- 1) Review conceptual models and interventions that have proved effective in decreasing bullying, fagging and related offenses.
- 2) Examine models that could increase protective factors and mitigate the negative effects of bullying.
- 3) Explore appropriate roles of different groups in preventing bullying

FOR WHOM: Heads of School and their assistants, HODs, Counselors, Hostel Managers, Caregivers.

WORKSHOP CONTENT:

- 1) In-depth understanding of bullying, fagging and related offenses, describe different types.
- 2) Discuss the harmful consequences of Bullying, fagging and related offenses.
- 3) Scope and dimensions of bullying, fagging and related offenses in Nigeria Schools. List the different types of bullying occurring among peers, in the families, in the schools, in the community and discuss various responses to them by peers/families/schools/communities.

- 4) Assess the personal beliefs of participants on bullying, fagging, cultism, and related offenses, and identify what has shaped this belief.
- 5) Expose and address harmful norms, beliefs, and attitudes about bullying, fagging, cultism, and related offenses in schools.
- 6) Consequences of bullying, fagging, cultism, and related offenses on individuals, families, schools, communities
- 7) Review how school policies, teachers' attitudes, and the general norms of a school can be a predictor of students' social and emotional development as well as their academic development.
- 8) Bullying, fagging, and cultism policies that work in Schools: a) Whole School approach. B) Traditional teacher-led and discipline-focused approaches with rules and consequences for those who engage in bullying.
- 9) Review existing rehabilitation and care for victims of bullying, fagging and related offenses.
- 10) Review existing legal and regulatory frameworks for addressing cases of bullying in schools.
